

# Novo Nordisk Haemostasis Award 2007

The Novo Nordisk Haemostasis Award was established to recognize outstanding original preclinical or clinical research that has contributed to better understanding of the mode of action or therapeutic potential of recombinant factor VIIa.

A panel of distinguished experts from both research and clinical backgrounds will judge each entry based on scientific merit, originality and potential impact on clinical practice. The submitting author of the winning abstract will be announced during the XXI ISTH Congress and will receive €15,000.

## Submission guidelines

- Submitted work must be either unpublished or due for publication only after the abstract deadline.
- Abstracts submitted for presentation at the XXI ISTH congress may also be entered for the Novo Nordisk Haemostasis Award.
- Unlike previous years, the award is open to researchers of all ages, not only young investigators.

## Abstract preparation guidelines

- Abstracts should be typed and single spaced within the borders of the abstract form.
- The title must be in CAPITAL letters and **bold** lettering.
- Institutional affiliations should be noted but not assigned to individual authors.
- Please **do not** include degrees or institutional appointments.
- Use a letter quality laser or ink-jet printer with 10 point or larger character type. Do not use a matrix printer.
- The text should be a single paragraph starting with a three-space indentation. Simple tables and graphs may be included, however, they must be neat and in black ink.
- The entire abstract including the title, authors, location, text, tables, and graphs (if included) must fit within the space provided.
- Standard abbreviations are acceptable. Any special abbreviations should be placed in brackets (parenthesis) after the first appearance of the full words they represents.
- All submissions should be in English.
